RE: Systematic Failure of Leadership, Official Oppression, and Fiscal Negligence

Chief Freis,

I am writing to formally demand your immediate resignation as Chief of Police for the Town of Addison. This demand is based on a documented, multi-year timeline of administrative failures, the active concealment of officer misconduct, and a catastrophic disregard for the fiscal integrity of this municipality.

I. The Warning and the Cover-Up (July 2024 – April 2025) In July 2024, following a citation involving Officer Allan Schieck, I provided your department with clear warnings that this officer was a liability to the public. In September 2024, I reiterated these warnings to the court and your administration. You chose not to listen. Instead, your department engaged in a coordinated effort to shield Schieck, suppressing exculpatory video evidence and providing false narratives regarding his conduct.

Because you chose to "turn him loose" rather than hold him accountable, the Laciana Archer incidents were allowed to occur. While I was warning you that Schieck was engaging in stalking-like behavior, your department was simultaneously investigating him for the illegal use of a tracking device on Ms. Archer's vehicle. You protected the predator while gaslighting the whistleblower.

II. The "Export" of a Known Liability Even after your own internal memorandum (April 7, 2025) admitted a "sustained pattern of poor judgment" and a "loss of confidence" in Schieck, you allowed him to separate in a manner that permitted him to secure a K9 Handler position at a neighboring agency. By failing to ensure a proper "Brady" disclosure and an accurate F-5 reporting, you exported a public safety threat to our neighbors in Little Elm and Savannah.

III. Official Oppression and Fiscal Indifference (March 3, 2026) The culture of "willful blindness" in your department reached a breaking point during the Town Hall on March 3, 2026. When I attempted to participate in the public forum to ask about the **\$190 million missing from the city treasury**, I was arrested for simply raising my hand.

Most damning, however, was your personal response during our encounter in the hallway. When confronted with the reality of nearly \$200 million in vanished public funds, you stated: **"I don't care."**

IV. Conclusion A Chief of Police who "doesn't care" about the disappearance of \$190 million of taxpayer money—and who actively protects officers with sustained histories of firearm negligence, reckless driving, and stalking—has forfeited the right to lead. Your administration has become a liability to the Town of Addison's treasury and a danger to its citizens' civil rights.

For the integrity of the badge and the safety of this community, you must step down immediately.

P.S.: Be advised that I have already formally alerted and filed detailed complaints with the following oversight and law enforcement organizations regarding the conduct of Officer Schieck, the missing TPIA records, and the suppression of evidence within your department:

- **The Texas Commission on Law Enforcement (TCOLE)** regarding licensee misconduct and F-5 reporting discrepancies.
- **The Denton County District Attorney's Public Integrity Unit** regarding "Brady" disclosure violations and official oppression.
- **The Texas Rangers (DPS)** regarding the investigation of official misconduct and potential evidence tampering.
- **The U.S. Department of Justice (DOJ)** regarding the systemic violation of civil rights and the targeting of whistleblowers.

Furthermore, let the record show that on March 4, 2026—the day after the Town Hall—I physically entered the Addison Police Station with the assembled evidence. I requested a meeting with you to present these facts and begged for a report to be taken with "open eyes." You refused to leave your office. The representative you sent to "handle" me didn't even bother to take notes or write down a single detail of the evidence I offered.

I will continue to provide updates and additional evidence to these agencies, as well as the media and the public via *Signal vs. Noise*, until full transparency is achieved and the missing public funds are accounted for. This investigation will not stop until there is an answer for every documented failure of your administration.

I have reviewed the incident described below, and found there were no violations of the law or policy. The in-car camera system automatically records the 30 seconds prior to the officer activating the camera, and in this case it seems the stop sign violation occurred a few seconds prior to the video footage being captured. There was no manipulation or destruction of any evidence.

We consider this matter closed.

Chief of Police, I am writing to express my outrage and deep concern about the actions of one of your officers, which I believe constitute serious misconduct and illegal behavior. This pertains to Citation 334269, where I was falsely accused of running a stop sign. Despite my assertions of innocence, the officer claimed to have video evidence of the alleged violation. I decided to take the case to court, because I knew for a fact, beyond a shadow of a doubt, that I had not run the stop sign, and that we could just watch the video together in court and come to the same conclusion. However, when I received the evidence packet, the video was incomplete and did not show the alleged infraction. I strongly believe that the officer and the prosecutor conspired to destroy the original evidence, which would have exonerated me. Furthermore, during the trial, the officer's testimony revealed a disturbing lack of knowledge about the speed limit on the road where the alleged violation occurred. He admitted to driving at nearly three times the posted speed limit, demonstrating gross incompetence and reckless disregard for public safety. This incident is not only a grave injustice but also a testament to the officer's character and fitness for duty. His actions undermine the integrity of your department and put the public at risk. I urge you to take immediate action to address this situation, ensure accountability, and prevent similar incidents in the future. This is one of the greatest frauds perpetrated against me in my entire life, but he did it with such ease and comfort. It's terrifying to think how many other innocents have been hurt by this man. As a citizen, I expect law enforcement officers to uphold the law and protect the community.
