Good Morning, I am again writing to you about Mr Alan Schieck and his driving, his character and fitness for duty. He nearly killed me last July when he was speeding through the neighborhood and wrote me a ticket to conceal his wrongdoing, we've talked about this. I don't think I ever mentioned the part where he testified that he had been a police officer, in Addison, for 17 years. 17 years patrolling this town, up and down these same streets everyday, and he doesn't know the speed limit on that road. He's either totally incompetent, or he's a liar, neither one should have a place on our police force.

It matters because he's still out there doing damage every single day. Yesterday I was at the corner bakery, in Dallas, in a parking lot, here comes Schieck, 50 mph through the parking lot, coming right at me, omg is he going to hit me?!?! Blows through the stop sign to make a right, blows through another sign to make a left, left turn across traffic, tires squealing. It was about 10:30 am, he was in number 360. This is reckless endangerment of my life and everyone else on the road, it's his job to keep us safe and yet he is the number one threat to public safety in this town.

Chief of Police, I am writing to express my outrage and deep concern about the actions of one of your officers, which I believe constitute serious misconduct and illegal behavior. This pertains to Citation 334269, where I was falsely accused of running a stop sign. Despite my assertions of innocence, the officer claimed to have video evidence of the alleged violation. **decided to take the case to court, because I knew for a fact, beyond a shadow of a doubt, that I had not run the stop sign, and that we could just watch the video together in court and come to the same conclusion.** However, when I received the evidence packet, the video was incomplete and did not show the alleged infraction. I strongly believe that the officer and the prosecutor conspired to destroy the original evidence, which would have exonerated me. Furthermore, during the trial, the officer's testimony revealed a disturbing lack of knowledge about the speed limit on the road where the alleged violation occurred. He admitted to driving at nearly three times the posted speed limit, demonstrating gross incompetence and reckless disregard for public safety. This incident is not only a grave injustice but also a testament to the officer's character and fitness for duty. His actions undermine the integrity of your department and put the public at risk. **I urge you to take immediate action to address this situation, ensure accountability, and prevent similar incidents in the future. This is one of the greatest frauds perpetrated against me in my entire life, but he did it with such ease and comfort, it's terrifying to think how many other innocents have been hurt by this man.**

Subject: Formal Sworn Complaint – Officer Allan Schieck

To the Enforcement Division,

Please find the attached formal complaint regarding Officer Allan Schieck, currently employed by the Elm Ridge Police Department (formerly of the Addison Police Department).

This complaint is being filed due to a documented pattern of sustained professional misconduct, public endangerment, and potential violations of the Texas Occupations Code regarding officer licensing and the reporting of separation (F-5).

The attached documentation includes evidence of:

- **Sustained Pattern of Misconduct:** An internal Addison PD memorandum stating a "loss of confidence" in the officer due to a "sustained pattern of poor judgment."
- **Public Safety Risks:** Documented incidents of driving 63mph in a school zone on the wrong side of the road and negligent discharge of a firearm in a locker room.
- **Official Misconduct:** Evidence of road rage and the alleged illegal installation of a tracking device (Apple AirTag) on a citizen's vehicle.
- **Failure of Supervision:** Documentation showing that current supervisors at Elm Ridge PD have been put on notice of these sustained findings and have explicitly stated, "I don't want to know," regarding the officer's disciplinary history.

As Officer Schieck is currently serving in a high-liability capacity as a K9 Handler, I am requesting an immediate review of his peace officer license and an audit of the F-5 separation reporting provided by his previous agency.

The Texas Commission on Law Enforcement (TCOLE) has received your complaint. A report was generated and assigned report number 26-2581.

After review of the complaint, it was determined your complaint is non-jurisdictional and does not fall within the purview of TCOLE rules under Title 37 Texas Administrative Code, or 1701 Texas Occupations Code. The report has been closed as "Non-Jurisdictional."

Complaints against law enforcement agencies or individuals within those agencies should be directed to the Internal Affairs unit of the department, or to the governing body of the agency, such as the city council or county commissioner's court. If you believe a civil rights violation has occurred, you may also seek redress by writing to the Federal Bureau of Investigation. The FBI uses applicable federal laws to investigate violations by public officials in federal, state, and local governments. A public official is any person elected, appointed, employed, or otherwise having a duty to maintain honest and faithful public service. The categories of public corruption investigated by the FBI include corruption within the ranks of law enforcement.

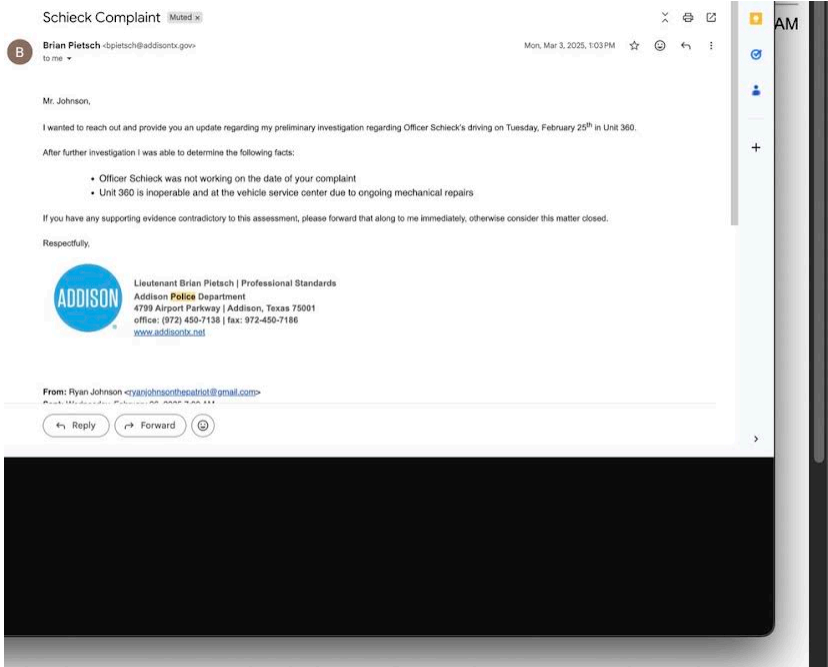
