I observed a suspicious vehicle and during contact was given consent to run my narcotics Police Service Dog (PSD) around the vehicle.

### Narratives

While on regular patrol I observed a vehicle behind the building in the 26800 block of E University Dr. The building is under construction and there is no reason for anyone to be behind the building at 0233 hours. As I drove up to the vehicle it was in the alley way behind the homes located on Chattahoochee. I observed the rear hatch of the vehicle to be open and it was occupied by 2 females.

The females advised the were curbing and going through peoples trash to find junk they could keep or sell. Knowing this as a common activity for users of illegal narcotics to fund their habit I engaged in conversation with the women about their criminal history. During the conversation both admitted to history with illegal controlled substances. I requested consent to have my narcotics PSD Marshall sniff the vehicle which they agreed to.

I had both occupants exit the vehicle and stand with the cover Officer while I deployed PSD Marshall from the rear bumper. PSD Marshall conducted a thorough sniff of the vehicle to include jumping up to smell the open cargo area. PSD Marshall detailed the cargo area carefully and with great detail. PSD Marshall showed no changes in behavior.

Both woman were calm and cooperative. Upon checking the Denton County Jail records the last time either was handled for narcotics by Denton County was in 2012.

I was pleased with PSD Marshall's performance.

On 3/4/26 at approximately 2311 hours, I was contacted by Oak Point PD Sgt Heidelberg #265. Sgt Heidelberg advised he had reasonable suspicion to extend his detention of a traffic stop and was requesting a K9 for an open air sniff.

I responded, without delay, taking the most direct route provided by Google Maps GPS.

Upon arrival, I deployed Police Service Dog (PSD) Marshall from the rear of the trailer. PSD Marshall began his sniff counter clockwise and was allowed to make his first pass at his pace. On the second, and third, pass I presented target areas and seams. PSD Marshall conduct quality sniffs of the vehicle and showed increased interest in the driver door seam on the primary vehicle but did not alert. As I began to take PSD Marshall back to the patrol vehicle he showed a change in behavior and began to detail the vehicle which was being transported on the flat bed trailer. PSD Marshall then alerted to the underside of the trailed vehicle by pointing, while rapidly wagging his tail, and whining.

I informed Sgt Heidelberg of the alert. I assisted in the PC search

On 2/26/26 at approximately 2109 hours, I was requested by Sgt Holland to be enroute to a traffic stop of a motorcycle which had come from a known drug house. Upon arrival, the driver had already been detained in handcuffs due to erratic behavior. Officer Landis, who had conducted the stop, was actively working on completing his traffic stop searches and documentation. Sgt Holland requested I deploy Police Service Dog (PSD) Marshall to attempt to locate any possible narcotic hides, which the drug house is known for.

I deployed PSD Marshall from the rear of the motorcycle. This being the first motorcycle PSD Marshall had conducted a sniff of I did not look at the deviation from his normal sniff pattern as any change of behavior. PSD Marshall conducted a quality sniff of the motorcycle and the drivers backpack which was on the ground beside the motorcycle. PSD Marshall did not alert nor did he show any changes in behavior.

After PSD Marshall was returned to the vehicle I requested permission to search the backpack at which time the driver gave consent.

I searched the backpack and did not find any illegal contraband or residue.

On 2/19/26 at approximately 1856 hours, I was contacted by Sgt M. Heidelman #265 of Oak Point PD requesting myself and K9 Marshall for a free air sniff of a vehicle he had stopped on traffic. Sgt Heidelman advised he had establish RS to extend his detention. I responded, without delay, taking the most direct route provided my GPS. Upon arrival, I tested an unknown substance recovered by Sgt Heidelman using the Mobile Detect test kit which was negative for the presence of illegal narcotics.

Sgt Heidelman requested I deploy Police Service Dog (PSD) Marshall. I deployed PSD Marshall from the center of the rear bumper and he began his sniff counter clockwise. PSD Marshall was allowed to make the initial pass at his own pace without presentation. On the second and third pass I presented target locations and seams to PSD Marshall. PSD Marshall showed no alert or significant changes in behavior. PSD Marshall was verbally praised and returned to his patrol kennel.

On 2/12/26 at approximately 2109 hours, I observed a white Kia (TX/ TTZ6947) in the parking lot of 27575 E University (Circle K). A check of the vehicle registration showed it to have expired December 2024. While parked behind the building, waiting for the vehicle to leave, I observed the passenger peak his head around the corner and quickly hide upon seeing my clearly marked Elm Ridge K9 vehicle. I moved location and as I did I observed the vehicle back out and upon seeing me it pulled into a gas pump as if it were getting gas. I observed the vehicle in the position for approximately 30 minutes before I observed the passenger walk around the vehicle looking for my patrol vehicle. The vehicle had a warrant for a female who was listed as aggressive towards law enforcement.

I made contact with the occupants and informed them of the suspicious behavior at which time they both admitted to attempting to wait me out and avoid contact. The driver was identified as Steven Fikes and the passenger Matthew Akin. Both advised to be staying at 1013 Hayden Ln. The address and Akin are both well known to the Elm Ridge PD for narcotic activity.

I requested consent to search the vehicle which Fikes originally consented to but then denied. Based on both occupants residing at a house known for narcotic activity, and Akin's history for narcotics as well as Akin's suspicious behavior looking for Officers I deployed Police Service Dog (PSD) Marshall.

PSD Marshall was deployed from the center of the rear bumper and began his sniff counter clockwise. PSD Marshall showed an increased interest in the passenger door area on his initial pass but after I applied pressure to the lead he reluctantly moved on. PSD Marshall showed a change behavior at the driver door where he jumped on the vehicle which he does not normally do unless he is in odor and looking for the source. Although PSD Marshall showed interest and a change in behavior he did not come to a full alert. Based on case law and the change in behavior PSD Marshall established probable cause for a search.

Before the search, I asked Fikes about the reason for interest and he stated he had just recently dealt with Dallas PD on the same circumstances and was unsure. Fikes advised his girlfriend, and vehicle owner, may have used recently but he has not seen her use since during the 3 months they have been dating.

No contraband was located during the PC search. It is possible that a recent occupant of the vehicle possessed narcotics and the odor was still present in the vehicle which caused the increased interest by PSD Marshall.

### Narratives

Name: Schieck Allen Rank: Officer

On 2/5/26 at approximately 0100 hours, I was requested by Cross Roads PD to conduct a free air sniff of a vehicle at 10001 US Hwy 380 (Prairie House Restaurant). I took the most direct route without delay. Upon arrival, the Officer who initiated the traffic stop advised he had reasonable suspicion that the driver and/or passenger were involved in criminal activity, mainly narcotics as the driver had recently been arrested for manufacture and delivery of a controlled substance. I asked if consent had been requested and was advised it had but was denied.

I had the Officer obtain consent to turn the vehicle off which was given and done but the front driver and passenger door windows were down.

I deployed Police Service Dog (PSD) Marshall, on his standard traffic lead, from the center of the rear bumper. PSD Marshall began his sniff counter clockwise and was allowed to conduct the first pass of the vehicle at his own pace. Upon reaching the driver door, PSD Marshall showed a distinct, and sudden, change in behavior by jumping onto the vehicle and sticking his nose in the window. I provided pressure on the lead however PSD Marshall did not want to leave and I had to call him off. PSD Marshall continued his sniff and upon reaching the rear bumper the second pass was conducted and I presented target areas. Upon reaching the driver door PSD Marshall again showed an extreme interest and began to lay down to get his nose under the vehicle. I applied slight pressure to the lead and attempted to present the rear door seam however PSD Marshall continued to linger at the driver door lower seam. After a few moments PSD Marshall reluctantly moved on.

Officer Schieck informed the initiating Officer that PSD Marshall had not given a final presentation but had showed a distinct, and sudden, change in behavior at the driver door. Under US v Masterson a distinct and sudden change in behavior establishes PC to search.

Officer Schieck assisted in the search of the vehicle during which marijuana "shake" was located in the center console and packaging for a THC Vape advertising 89.7% total THC was located in the trunk.

I was pleased with PSD Marshall's thoroughness of checking the target locations and seams as well as his sniff pattern.

On 1/15/26 at approximately 1948 hours, I stopped a vehicle for a traffic violation. The subject had an invalid license and it was further discovered the vehicle, which he advised was not his, had expired registration. Officer Lee and Sgt Holland arrived as cover Officers and I had Officer Lee complete the citations while I deployed PSD Marshall.

Due to the number of people PSD Marshall was distracted and would not urinate before the sniff. It should be noted that PSD Marshall sniffed this vehicle on 1/4/26, and while he showed interest in the driver door, he did not alert.

I was not pleased with PSD Marshall's sniff with his flightiness and jitters. This will be corrected through mock stop training.

Officer Schieck took the most direct route according to Google Maps. Upon arrival, Officer Schieck was informed the driver and vehicle were known for dealing in small amount of narcotics, namely methamphetamine. Denton PD advised they had probable cause to believe the driver had just made a narcotics transaction inside the nearby CVS.

Officer Schieck deployed PSD Marshall at the center of the front bumper and PSD Marshall began his pattern counter clockwise. PSD Marshall immediately showed a change in behavior by changing directions and going clockwise. PSD Marshall lingered around the right corner of the front bumper before continuing counter clockwise. PSD Marshall was allowed to search the first pass at his own pace without presentations. PSD Marshall lingered around the right rear tail light and paced back and forth sniffing intently. PSD Marshall continued to the front right corner panel, again, showing an increased interest.

Officer Schieck instructed PSD Marshall for a 2nd pass, during which he made presentations on target areas such as door seams and wheel wells.

PSD Marshall, again, showed an extreme interest in the right rear tail light but did not present final. Officer Schieck continued to present and upon reaching the front right wheel well, PSD Marshall stuck his head in as far as he could, before pulling his head out and presenting final by pointing his nose, with a rigid body, and rapidly wagging his tail side to side.

A search of the vehicle revealed 2 magnetic stash boxes, each containing a white crystal like residue.

Inside the engine bay, there was excessive tooling on the front right fender bolts indicating it had been removed and reinstalled multiple times. The front left fender did not have the same tooling marks. An aftermarket tracker was located attached to the fuse box.

Denton PD advised a female had been arrested in the vehicle 2 days prior for possession of methamphetamine as well as a female who had been an occupant in the vehicle early morning of 11/2/25 had OD'd on methamphetamines and died later on during the evening/night of 11/2/25.

The stash boxes containing residue, and the information about the vehicle being known to have recently contained methamphetamines reaffirms the presentation final by PSD Marshall.

There were non arrest made.

Denton PD seized the magnetic stash boxes.

During the front seat interview the driver was extremely interested in Police Service Dog (PSD) Marshall and his job as a narcotics detection K9.

Officer Douglas arrived as a backup officer.

While Officer Douglas continued to complete a warning for the expired MVR Officer Schieck deployed PSD Marshall. PSD Marshall was deployed from the center of the front bumper. Officer Schieck gave PSD Marshall the track command at which time he began tracking, with his nose to the ground, west then north. PSD Marshall had not been given a restroom break prior to the track due to handler error and stopped to use the restroom multiple times.

PSD Marshall came across numerous dogs on leash and a cat in the park. PSD Marshalls normal behavior when seeing a dog or cat on leash is to hyperfocus on the other animal and aggressively bark and attempt to get to the other animal to the point he will stand on his hind legs keeping the leash tight. Upon seeing each animal PSD Marshall would let out a short quiet whine and push his nose into the ground and continue his track. Officer Schieck believes this deviation from normal behavior indicated PSD Marshall was in odor and on the right track.

Upon reaching a house at a pivotal intersection a small dog escaped from its home and came after PSD Marshall while it was off leash. Officers Schieck and Goldstein stepped in front of PSD Marshall and Officer Schieck held PSD Marshall back and redirected him.

PSD Marshall was placed in a down and recast but did not appear to locate the odor and the track was terminated.

Upon locating the juvenile he would not advise his route he took from his home but was locate northeast of where PSD Marshall encountered the loose dog and lost the odor.

Officer Schieck was pleased with PSD Marshall's performance, especially in the area of ignoring distractions and focusing on the track. Officer Schieck feels more tracks in neighborhoods could increase PSD Marshall's performance.

Officer Schieck removed all occupants from the vehicle. Officer Schieck failed to have the driver roll up his windows.

Officer Schieck deployed Police Service Dog (PSD) Marshall from the center of the front bumper. PSD Marshall conducted the first pass of the vehicle, counter clockwise, at his speed without any presentations. PSD Marshall showed interest in the left rear passenger door area and lingered before continuing on.

Upon reaching the starting point Officer Schieck began to present target areas such as the wheel wells and door seams. PSD Marshall again showed interest in the left rear passenger door and jumped on the side of the vehicle. Officer Schieck corrected this behavior and attempted to move on from the door. PSD Marshall again jumped on the side of the vehicle attempting to put his nose in the open window before getting down. The track was approximately 1-1.5 hours old and the direction of travel was unknown. It should be noted the area was highly contaminated with vehicle traffic along with people and dogs.

Officer Schieck deployed PSD Marshall (with Sgt Ferguson as his cover) from the front door of the residence which is believed to be where the juvenile had left the location with her dog. PSD Marshall pulled hard on the track, leaving the house to the right and crossing numerous surfaces, for approximately .2 miles (according to google directions). After approximately .2 miles PSD Marshall lost odor of what he was tracking and disengaged. Officer Schieck ended the track and walked back to the residence.

The juvenile later returned home and when Officer Schieck asked her the path she had taken she advised she had exited the house and gone left to where a friend was waiting in a car to give her a ride.

This performance was unacceptable to Officer Schieck even with the extenuating circumstances. Officer Schieck will conduct more training on tracks.

PSD Marshall moved counter clockwise sticking his nose in the fender well, spaces in the wheels, jumping to check high and continued to the left rear wheel at which time he changed directions and returned to the driver door. PSD Marshall came to presentation final by pointing his nose at the bottom door seam with, with a rigid body, and rapidly wagging his tail side to side. PSD Marshall was rewarded with his ball tug and verbal praise.

On 8/30/25 at approximately 0309 hours, Officer Schieck observed a red Cadillac (#####) with a defective license plate light at Hwy 380 and FM 1385.

Officer Schieck initiated a traffic stop, by activating his emergency lights and siren, stopping the vehicle at Hwy 380 and Savannah Blvd.

Officer Schieck contacted the driver who identified himself by presenting #####. The driver refused to make eye contact and looked straight ahead with a dead stare. Officer Schieck detected the smell of gasoline coming from the vehicle interior and observed numerous packages which filled the entire vehicle interior.

Officer Schieck requested a cover Officer and began working on the license check and entering the ticket writer information. Upon the arrival of the cover Officer, Officer Schieck gave him instructions to finish the ticket writer form.

Officer Schieck removed the driver of the vehicle and had him stand in a safe position away from traffic.

Officer Schieck deployed police service dog (PSD) Marshall at the center of the vehicle (Front license plate) and gave the command to search. PSD Marshall began his sniff counter clockwise. As he reached the driver door his sniff intensified and he attempted to put his paws on the door window frame where the window was down. Officer Schieck pulled PSD Marshall off and instructed him to continue searching. PSD Marshall continued around the vehicle.

Upon reaching the starting point, Officer Schieck began to present the wheel well and door seams. Upon reaching the driver door PSD Marshall again showed increased interest and his sniffing intensified with deep air intake and exhales.

PSD Marshall came to presentation final by pointing his nose, with a rigid body while rapidly wagging his tail side to side, at the bottom door seam of the driver door.

PSD Marshall was verbally praised and placed back in the patrol vehicle. Officer Schieck informed the driver of the positive alert and asked if there was anything illegal in the vehicle. The driver stated "I knew he'd alert...I've been through this before."
